2. Ben has written a pamphlet on what our response to difficulties should be prayer and faith in God. This will also be translated into Swahili, Luban and Bemba and distributed to our churches to help and encourage people. Ben was also invited to preach on a Christian television channel last Sunday so he was able to share this message with many who watched this broadcast.
3. As church activities are no longer allowed Homer is meeting with small groups of children in homes to teach and encourage them.
