

Medical and Security Situation Update—Lubumbashi

Dr Serge was admitted to hospital on April 10th at 4 am with extreme pain in his abdomen. He underwent ultra sound and x ray examinations and laboratory tests and the doctors have discovered that he has a kidney stone 13mm x 8mm. They are attempting to resolve the problem by treating him with anti inflammatory medication and fluid intake. Please pray for wisdom especially if Serge is required to have surgery. We are investigating some options for appropriate surgical care if this becomes needed.

Concern from a significant increase in banditry in the city of Lubumbashi has been reported. Up to 30 homes a day have attacked with vehicles used to remove valuables. Rape of women and in some cases children and murder have also been reported. Today a report of 52 bandits being arrested is a welcome development but prayer for this situation has been requested by the board.
